

John 12.20-33

Sunday Reflection: Choose the path of surrender in service to the Lord. In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to choose the Lord first, and the Father will honor whoever serves him. Choosing the path of surrender in service to him glorifies God and allows us to produce much fruit, including care for our own families. 5th Sunday of Lent - What is the reason for the veiling of crosses and images? The veiling of crosses and images is a sort of "fasting" from sacred depictions which represent the paschal glory of our salvation. Just as the Lenten fast concludes with the Paschal feast, so too, our fasting from the cross culminates in an adoration of the holy wood on which the sacrifice of Calvary was offered for our sins. Likewise, a fasting from the glorious images of the mysteries of faith and the saints in glory, culminates on the Easter night with a renewed appreciation of the glorious victory won by Christ, risen from the tomb to win for us eternal life.

Holy Week at Sacred Heart 2024

All are warmly welcomed to Holy Week at our parish! This week is the holiest week of the year for the Catholic Church. This week the Church commemorates Christ's death and burial. May we each encounter Jesus in the way that will allow us to grow in deeper union with him, closely connected to his love and his spirit of life in the resurrection. May each of you be blessed on your journey throughout the Holy Triduum.

Fast and abstain on upcoming Holy Day - The Church prescribes fasting (only one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not greater than a full meal) and abstinence from meat on Good Friday. Catholics aged 18-59 are bound to fast; those 14 and older to abstinence. Those who are ill are freed from these obligations.
