Sunday, January 7th, 2024 Epiphany of the Lord

We observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay homage to the Lord. Alleluia. Matthew 2.2

<u>Sunday Reflection:</u> With Christ's help we can be his light for others. We are not the source of the light that a world in darkness needs desperately. Instead, we must receive Jesus, the Light of the World, so that we can in turn share it. And as we heard in the first reading: Then you shall be radiant ... your heart shall throb and overflow. Jesus has come to give all the love we need, all the wisdom called for, all the virtue necessary to be a light to others. <u>LITURGY OF THE WORD</u> In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah promises that Jerusalem will be a light for all nations. In the Letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul explains the revelation that the Gentiles are members of the same body of Christ. In the Gospel, magi from the east look for the newborn king, finally finding the child with his mother, Mary. Faith Catholic.
